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PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Criminal Justice introduces students to public safety occupations and what it takes to protect and serve a community. Practical instruction focuses on the daily duties of police officers and other professionals of the justice system. Topics include law enforcement, forensics, homeland security, conservation, and the legal proceedings of the criminal justice system. Criminal Justice I Introduces specialized classroom and practical experiences related to public safety occupations such as law enforcement, loss prevention services, and homeland security. This course provides an introduction to the purposes, functions, and history of the three primary parts of the criminal justice system as well as an introduction to the investigative process. Oral and written communication skills will be reinforced through activities that model public relations and crime prevention efforts as well as the preparation of police reports.

- 2. Distinguish between the various functions of segments of the criminal justice system
- 3. Demonstrate an understanding of corrections and incarceration
- 4. Analyze the nature of crime

- 7. Assess and implement approved safety procedures and defensive tactics for law enforcement
- 8. Establish positive relationships with people from diverse backgrounds
