PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The program uses an active learning approach that utilizes higher order thinking, communication, leadership, and management processes to study education and related careers. Students will explore teaching through field experiences in local elementary classrooms and preschools. Students are monitored and evaluated during their field experiences throughout year one and two. During both years, students gain experience in planning, writing, and implementation of developmentally appropriate lesson plans; evaluating and selecting quality children's literature; completing classroom observations; applying standards; and investigating licensing requirements related to careers in education. Students complete a portfolio project to document their experiences.
