PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Students in the Criminal Justice program gain both classroom instruction and hands-on experiences related to careers in public safety. They explore the history, purpose, and functions of the three main components of the criminal justice system, while also being introduced to the investigative process.

Communication skills are emphasized through activities in public relations and crime prevention, helping students strengthen both oral and written abilities. The program also examines current trends in law enforcement and the broader field of criminal justice. In addition, simulator equipment may be used to train students in proper use-of-force procedures, providing a realistic introduction to law enforcement practices.
