PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The program uses an active learning approach that emphasizes higher-order thinking, communication, leadership, and management skills to study education and related careers. Students explore teaching through field experiences in local elementary schools, where they are monitored and evaluated throughout both years of the program.

During these experiences, students gain valuable practice in planning, writing, and delivering developmentally appropriate lesson plans; evaluating and selecting quality children's literature; conducting classroom observations; applying academic standards; and investigating licensing requirements for careers in education. Over the course of the program, students also build a professional portfolio that documents their growth, skills, and experiences, preparing them for future opportunities in the field of education.

Graduates also have opportunities to enter the workforce in early learning centers, after-school programs, or as paraprofessionals in schools, gaining valuable experience while continuing their education. Some students may also explore related career pathways in human services and community programs.
