PROGRAM OVERVIEW

In this program, students explore how to plan, design, and analyze visual solutions for real-world communication challenges. They learn to combine imagery, text, and layout to create effective messages for advertising, promotional materials, displays, and more.

Students build communication skills through group critiques and by working directly with local clients, gaining experience in professional collaboration. Hands-on training emphasizes proper production methods for both large- and small-format printing. Second-year students expand into multimedia design and develop a professional portfolio, preparing them for college and careers. Throughout the program, students work with Adobe Creative Cloud Suite, the industry-standard software for design.
