PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Health Science students gain foundational knowledge and hands-on skills for careers in the medical field. Coursework includes human anatomy and physiology, medical terminology, medical ethics, CPR, and practical skills used across health-related occupations. In the second year, students participate in extended clinical experiences at healthcare sites, with the opportunity to earn CNA and CCMA certifications as well as Ivy Tech Certificates in CNA and Dementia Care.

Additional certification opportunities, such as Pharmacy Technician, may be pursued outside of regular class time. This program prepares students for immediate employment in long-term care facilities or for continuing their education in postsecondary healthcare programs.

Dual credits are earned in both years. Earn the Ivy Tech Certificates in CNA and Dementia Care at WCC. Take dual credit classes at your high school to work toward the next steps of a Technical Certificate and/or Associate in a health related field. Students who have earned the Ivy Tech Certificate in CNA are eligible to participate in Ivy Tech Richmond's commencement ceremony.

NEXT CAREER STEPS

Upon completion of the Health Science program, students are prepared for multiple pathways in healthcare, including direct employment in long-term care facilities with their CNA and Dementia Care certifications, or further study in 2- and 4-year college programs such as nursing, imaging, or respiratory therapy. With the Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) credential students can also qualify for immediate roles in doctors' offices, outpatient clinics, and specialty practices, where they perform both administrative and clinical duties such as scheduling, assisting with exams, running lab tests, and maintaining patient records. Together, these credentials give graduates the flexibility to enter the workforce, continue higher education, pursue additional certifications, or advance through military service, all while building a strong foundation for a career in healthcare.
